Old Business:

***TV Station-** Kris Darlington has sent a link to ES Staff to view the announcements folder. 9 students participating. Michelle would like to purchase a tricastor for T V station. (possibly use funds from the spring fundraiser) Michelle has put the links on the website for parents to view. Kris Darlington has suggested that the purchase of the tricastor be used to make one TV station for both Elementary and High School students.

***School Banking-** February 28th the school will be presented a check for \$440.00 for the 44 new accounts. An incentive program to bank is running where students who make a deposit will be put into a drawing to win \$25.00. Banking will officially end for the year June 6th. Barb Mead to help out with Wednesday deposits when Christine is away. An information table will be set up at K registration.

***Back to School Night - Scheduled for August 30, 2018 5:30-7:00.** The following food trucks-Kent's Crazy Horse and Mike's Hot Dogs. Mallory waiting to hear back from Air Stream Catering (518-587-0905) and Dizzy Chicken.(518-409-4999) Nadine checked with Village Pizzeria and they want a \$1,000.00 down so she has a call into Pies on Wheels. Mr. Ding-A-Ling is booked for the night.(Brian 518-221-5572). We are looking to book three food trucks for the event.

Box Tops Fundraiser- Is currently in process and they are coming in like crazy! We are having a challenging time keeping up with counting because of the amount of time that we are spending on gluing Box Tops. We ask that all are glued to papers so that counting is easier on us and it is easier to visibly see expiration dates. Due to the vast number coming in, the winners will not be announced until the Monday we return from break. We will then schedule the breakfast with the winning class.

Clynk fundraiser- Will begin when we return from break. We are asking for rinsed out cans and bottles to submit to Clynk. For every \$1.00 we earn (20 bottles), we get an additional \$0.50. We will have a collection bin outside of the cafeteria, and also will be collecting each Saturday morning in the month of March. The contest runs from February 28th- March 26th. We are also competing against the other schools in NY that are participating and the top school will win \$1,500!

EBT will be supporting the Student Council on a **Spring Fundraiser**. The goal is to sell 200 tickets for \$50.00 a ticket. A drawing will take place the night of Friday, June 1st. First prize \$2000.00, second prize \$1,000.00 and third prize \$500.00. The Committee is brainstorming other prizes to give away as well. It has not been decided how the money raised will be allocated (It will more than likely go towards the TV Station to purchase a Tricaster). More details to follow as the event is planned. BOCES will print tickets and flyer. The flyer will be sent out after April break about selling the tickets.

***Book Fair** - The next theme for the spring Book Fair is PETS. The PTSA would like to coordinate an evening event with EBT and the Student Council

on Thursday, May 10th. EBT will have 3 sessions of 6 Break Out Boxes , 8 people per table for 30 minutes each (LGI room) as well as many other activities being planned by PTSA. Dorothy checked with Nadine and the Spaghetti Dinner is a go. There will be 3 seatings at 5:00, 5:45, and 6:30. A flyer will be sent home to reserve your spot. (100 max per seating) Robotics will sell desserts. Christine will design flyer to be sent out March 25th. The fall Book Fair received 2nd place nationally and therefore receives \$1,000.00 of scholastic money.

***Post Office-** Michelle looked into lessons with keyboarding as a way to do the letters. However, students will need to reach mastery level for keyboarding before this can take place. Some students may reach the mastery level by Feb. or March and then these lessons will be considered.

*** School Dismissal Manager- Up and running!** This is a tool for parents to change a student's dismissal schedule as well as report an absence. Parents will have access to activate their account on December 12th. It will officially begin after Christmas break. No changes can be made after 1:25 pm unless a call is placed to Michelle. Teachers will be sent an email at the end of the day with any changes to a child's dismissal schedule. Bus drivers will also have access to an updated list. Michelle will offer a few times to parents if they want to see a demo on how it works. The school will now have a time stamp for every child. If a household does not have internet a note can still be sent and the information will be uploaded to the program.

***Growth Mindset- February- Aspiration**

In order to promote our Growth Mindset initiative, each month teachers will receive mindful tickets representing that month's theme. When students demonstrate the qualities of that growth mindset term, please give them one of the tickets. It is their responsibility to put their name and their teacher's name on the ticket.
