PRESENTATIONS

- Paul Levin, Science Department Head, presented to the Board an overview of the Science Department at Galway which included classes currently offered, college courses offered and information on the regents exams.
- An overview of the Capital Outlay Project was presented by Courtney Sayward. Capital Outlay projects are smaller projects in nature and are \$100,000 or less. This project has been submitted to the State Education Department for approval and more information will be provided as we obtain same.
- Michael Miller gave a report on how students can navigate the Naviance website for their high school career path and how parents can become involved in this process.
- Carter Whalen, FFA Advisor, advised the Board that the FFA club has 32 members. The club works very hard throughout the school year with various activities and fundraisers.
- Elise Britt presented the athletic report for the fall sports program which included a scholar athlete report.
- A summer school report was presented by Michael Miller for the Jr./Sr. High School and Michelle McDougall for the Elementary School. These reports included the number of students in attendance, classes taught and overall academic performance.
- The Facilities Committee met for the first time this year to discuss the 2.2 million dollar project voted on by the voters. More information on this project will be presented in the coming months.
- The Safety Committee met and discussed medical emergency information forms for staff and discussed the classes of hazardous materials. Also discussed was after school safety. A team will be sent into all the classrooms to make sure all safety

protocols in place are being followed. An evacuation drill will be conducted in the Spring of 2022.

- Finance Committee met and reviewed all the financial reports for the coming year. More information to follow at future meetings.
- Dr. Brita Donovan reviewed the Legislative Priorities for 2022-2023 including Fund and Adjust the Foundation Formula, Increase the threshold on BOCES Aid for CTE and Building Aid for Small Capital Projects.

Crystal Pashley informed the Board of bills currently in the NYS Legislature. There
are six bills that will greatly impact New Yorkers. In particular, Bill A8378, which will
extend immunization needed to attend schools in NYS which includes the Covid 19
vaccination. Many parents are not willing to give this vaccination to their children and
she is asking that the Board look into this further.

- Helen Christopher would like to see students introduced to more trades and not only college.
- Matthew Weaver would like to be provided with data pertaining to why there will no longer be temperature checks before children enter school in the morning.
- Kris DuBuge a representative from NY Informed advised the Board that NY Informed represents 20 counties with 1500 members and growing. Saratoga County has 390 members currently. NY Informed represents teachers, students, staff, parents and community members. Their main goal is to inform administrators and the Board of the different policies and mandates that are currently in place in NYS.
- Neil Evans thinks it is great to see the athletes at Galway both successful at their sport and their academics.
- Jeremy Sowle would like to be able to speak with the Board members at one of their Executive Sessions. He is hoping he can speak with them soon. He also would like to see trades being introduced to students as well as college.
- Marsha Kimmer feels that trades and college should be options for the students and not just college.

To approve the following resolution regarding the Board of Education's 2022 Advocacy Priorities:

RESOLUTION DATED November 18, 2021

GALWAY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION REGARDING ADVOCACY PRIORITIES FOR THE 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, the Galway Central School District strives to provide an outstanding education and post-secondary pathway for each and every student; and

WHEREAS, the district recognizes the deep commitment shown by the legislature and the Executive to fully fund the foundation formula; and

WHEREAS, the District works diligently to meet the needs of all students while still fulfilling its core mission, even while in our third year of a pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the District is facing significant increased costs due to inflationary factors for labor, fuel and goods; and

WHEREAS, property tax levy legislation at the state level has provided an increased need for State Aid to maintain quality programs; and

WHEREAS, public schools are being asked to do more for students than ever before, so they are prepared for college, military or a career; and

WHEREAS, each child in Galway Central School District only has one opportunity to go through the full elementary and secondary educational experience;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Galway Central School District Board of Education calls on the New York State Legislature and Governor Andrew Cuomo to act upon the following priorities:

- 1. Fund and Adjust the Foundation Formula
 - A. Include a due minimum increase for all districts, regardless of Foundation Aid phase-in level.
 - B. Maintain the "SAVE Harmless" provision.
 - D. Fully fund expense based aids.
- 2. Increase the \$30,000 threshold on BOCES Aid for Career and Technical Education (CTE) Programs by providing 100% aidability for the salaries of CTE teachers
- 3. Building Aid for Small Capital Projects

A. Increase the threshold for base year capital outlay expenses from the current amount, established in 2002 from \$100,000 to \$250,000 to assist districts in making critical capital improvements.
